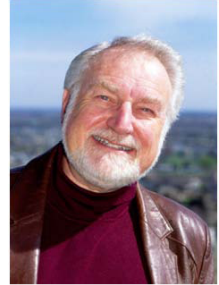
CLERGY:

John “Jack” Dawson

October 12, 1934 – January 22, 2018

The Reverend John “Jack” Dawson died January 22, 2018. He is survived by his wife, Marlene, children Deborah, Wes, and Catherine, and four grandchildren.

Reverend Dawson served at Long Forest UMC and Glen Mar UMC in the Baltimore-Washington Conference; Boise First (Cathedral of the Rockies) UMC, Mountain States Tumor Institute, and the Patient and Family Support institute in the Oregon-Idaho Conference. He retired in 1996.



Betty Noble Luginbill

February 1, 1926 – December 12, 2017

The Reverend Betty Luginbill died December 12, 2017. She is survived by her children, James, Pamela, Stephen and Michael, nine grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. She was predeceased by her husband, Philip Luginbill.



Betty was born in Burlington, Wisconsin to Herbert and Ruth May Noble. She earned Master's Degrees in Home Economics (Purdue), Christian Education (Scarritt College) and Divinity (Garrett Evangelical Seminary), with an undergraduate degree in Home Economics (Wisconsin). She became a Diaconal Minister in 1977, at the age of 51 and then a Provisional Elder, attaining membership in full connection in 1983.

Reverend Luginbill served as a Missionary in the Alaska Conference; Gold Hill/Upper Rogue, Sweet Home and Boise: Collister in the Oregon-Idaho Conference. She retired in 1994. She was active in many social causes that centered around her faith, which included jail ministry, civil rights, and efforts to help persons in poverty. She also enjoyed travel and had visited all 50 states and over 20 countries.

Eun Soo (Samuel) Park

September 9, 1958 – May 5, 2018

The Reverend Eun Soo Park died on May 5, 2018. He is survived by his wife Hye Jung (Heather), and children Ae Joo Park of Boston and Young Joo Park of Cornelius, Oregon.

Rev. Park became a full member of the Oregon-Idaho Annual Conference in 1998. He served as Director of the Oregon Korean Community Center from November 2013 until his death. He was also serving as pastor of Woori Korean UMC at the time of his death. He had served as pastor of Grace Korean UMC in Beaverton, as well.



David Oldham Poindexter

January 30, 1929 – February 8, 2018



The Reverend David Poindexter died February 8, 2018. He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Marian, and son, James Poindexter.

David Poindexter was born in Oregon and received a B.A. from Willamette University in 1951. He continued his education at Boston University where he received an additional Bachelor's degree and his Master's degree in Theology. He attended BU at the same time as, and became friends with, Martin Luther King, Jr.

After serving as pastor of Parkrose UMC in Portland for eight years, he moved to New York City to work with the National Council of Churches in communications and promotion. Following this work, he was appointed as Director of the Communication Center of the Population Institute from 1970-1985. In this role he was able to work with entertainment, government and communications leaders to champion the use of radio and television to promote family planning, gender equity, and protection of the environment. His influence extended beyond American media to Mexico and India. In 1985, Rev. Poindexter founded Population Communications International, which he served as president until 1998. He continued his work of promoting the same values around the world through this platform, and various other NGOs until and after his retirement in 1998. His life and work are captured in his autobiographical book, *Out of the Darkness of Centuries*, published in 2009.

Stuart Robert Shaw

December 4, 1932 – May 18, 2018

The Reverend Stuart Shaw died May 18, 2018. He is survived by his wife, Donna, and children: Stanley Shaw, Eric Shaw, LaRae Shaw-Meadows and André Shaw, and two grandchildren.

A fourth-generation clergyman, he was born in Spokane, Washington to Reverend Robert B. Shaw and Ruth V. Howes. Stuart earned his BA at Willamette University in 1954. He received his Master of Divinity degree at Pacific School of Religion in 1957 and did post-graduate work at New College University of Edinburgh, Scotland and Pacific School of Religion from 1958-1960. He was ordained an elder in full connection in the Pacific Northwest Conference in 1957 and transferred to the Oregon-Idaho Conference in 1960.

His ministry career included serving as a minister of youth in Oakland and San Bruno, California, and as a pastor in Alameda, CA. In Oregon he served as pastor of Stayton First UMC, Vermont Hills (Portland), Laurelwood (Portland), St. Helens, Monmouth, North Bend and Klamath Falls. He also served as director of the Wesley Foundation at the University of Oregon from 1982-1984. He retired in 1998.

He was active in social causes and groups in every community in which he lived, and was an avid outdoor person. He traveled around the US for whole year in a Volkswagen bus, which he modified for the trip.

John Skien

July 28, 1928 – November 25, 2017

The Reverend John Skien died November 25, 2017. He is survived by his daughters, Lora Skien-Marshall and Jane.

Reverend Skien served at Summerfield (Houston), St. Paul (Newton) and St. Paul's (Bryan) in the Texas Conference. In the Yellowstone Conference he served Messiah UMC in Billings, MT. In the Rocky Mountain Conference he served Centenary-Grace UMC (Salt Lake City, UT), Warren UMC (Denver, CO), and First UMC (Aurora, CO). In the Oregon-Idaho Conference, he served Lakeview/Paisley, Jordan Valley, Cave Junction/Wilderville and a Ministry to Urban Singles. He retired in 1993.

HONORABLE LOCATION:**Richard Floyd Burdon***February 18, 1931 - January 19, 2018*

The Reverend Richard Burdon, Honorable Location Retired, died January 19, 2018.

Reverend Burdon began his ministry career in Central Pennsylvania, serving Dudley and Rehoboth there. In 1962 he became an elder in full connection in the Oregon Conference. He served Wallowa/Flora, American Falls/Aberdeen, and North Bend before going on Voluntary Location in 1970.

James Edward McCobb*January 25, 1928 - April 26, 2017*

The Reverend James McCobb, Honorable Location Retired, died April 26, 2017. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Marilyn (Mack) McCobb; six children; 11 grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren. He is predeceased by his son Thomas McCobb and sister Elizabeth Lazzaro.

Reverend McCobb began his ministry career in Southern New England, serving at Forest Hills-Hyde Park. He became an elder in full connection of the Oregon Conference in 1958. He served Portland First UMC, Beaverton, and Corvallis before going on Voluntary Location in 1977.

James went on to a 50-year career as an attorney. He was an avid hiker and outdoorsman and also wrote and self-published several books of poetry. He was an active member of Rotary International.

She graduated from high school in Worthington, OH and graduated from college at Florida Southern College in Lakeland, Florida, where she met her husband, John. They married in 1959. John is a United Methodist Elder in full connection (retired) in the Florida Conference. He and Bee served churches in Florida, Alaska, Idaho and Oregon for more than 40 years. Luann Enz, widow of Reverend Dr. Clark S. Enz, died July 23, 2017. She is survived by her children, Linnea Enz Chu, Reverend Jonathan Enz, and Karen Rose Enz Hunter, as well as six grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Born in Madison, Kansas, Luann was the only child of Samuel Harrison Green and Rose Logsdon Green. The family moved to Salem, Oregon because of the depression, where Luann attended Willamette University. There she met another transplanted Kansan, Clark Enz.

Married in 1942, Luann was a true ministry partner to her husband. Over the years she served as unpaid church secretary, choir director, Sunday School teacher, parish hostess, and even softball coach. Together they ministered to churches in Dallas, Oak Grove Chapel, Cottage Grove, Oregon City, Roseburg, Tigard, and Gresham. She also supported him in his work as Central District Superintendent. Internationally they represented the church in gatherings in Singapore, Kenya, Brazil and Israel. Rev. Enz retired in 1984.

Family, education and music were passions in her life. After her children were in school, Luann entered graduate studies to earn a teaching degree. While living in Oregon City, she discovered that a local grade school had no music program so she teamed with a piano-playing friend to volunteer once a week, engaging the children in song. Her home was alive with music, camps songs, Broadway musicals and classic church hymns being her favorites.
